Health Issues Related to Marijuana

Pharmacologic effects

- A. Dulls sensorium
- B. Impairs judgement with decreased perception of harm
- most worrisome when operating an automobile

- Skills required when operating a vehicle:
- LD -Lane position- measures driver's ability to maintain consistent control of cars position and trajectory
- DA- Divided attention test measures ability to process and coordinate multiple information streams
- CT- Critical tracking ability to remain focused on important visual objects moving in visual field

Net Result

- Increase Risk (odds ratio) for both non-fatal and fatal MVA's whether THC alone or the THC + Alcohol
- Odds Ratio:

THC + ETOH

- Non-Fatal 5.8
 10.9
- Fatal 2.3-6.6 14.1-17.4

C. Addictive Effects

- Particularly worrisome in adolescents increases potential for addiction to other drugs
- Earlier onset of substance abuse of other drugs
- Use of narcotics in age 12-17
 - o Colorado #1
 - o Massachusetts #8
- Increased incidence of opioid deaths in Colorado since legalization
- 2000 % Increase in admissions to Colorado pediatric ICU's since legalization

D. Increased risks for adolescents:(Colorado Data)

- psychosis X5
- depression/anxiety X1.8
- bipolar disorders X2.7
- Suicide X7

66% of adolescent E.R. visits for "mental illness" issues

E. In adolescents –decrease in I.Q.

- Is it reversible?
- Also- decreased attention, memory, academic performance/achievement with use of THC

Other important facts impacting health

- It isn't your Father's or Grandfather's Marijuana.
 Dramatic increase in strength & purity of marijuana (THC) products. Who regulates this?
- Dramatic increase in ways to consume marijuana: smoking, juuling, vaping, drinking, ingesting brownies, candy etc.
 - Clearly increased risk for unintended ingestionespecially by children but also by unsuspecting adults
- 3. Increase in crime follows legalization
