This statewide toll-free number offers assistance in 160 different languages.

FoodSource Hotline counselors refer callers to food resources in their community as well as provides them with information about school meals, summer meal sites for kids, elder meals programs, and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). When relevant, they also connect callers with utility, fuel assistance, and MassHealth. All information is kept strictly confidential.

SNAP (Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program)



MassLegal Services' FAQs about SNAP eligibility during the COVID-19 crisis is available here. The Families First Coronavirus Response Act (P.L. 116-127) (FFCRA or the Act) authorized a temporary assistance program for households with children affected by school closures during the public health emergency that was declared on January 27, 2020.

The Massachusetts Department of Transitional Assistance and the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education will issue P-EBT benefits to current Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) households and non-SNAP households, which include children eligible for free and reduced-price school meals, through the State's SNAP EBT card system.
