Statement from Supt. Arthur Unobskey:

“We need to do multiple things. All of these students are our children and we need to come together as a community to make sure they know our schools are safe. And, to do that, we need to make it clear that we do not tolerate hateful words, that we are eager to engage in honest, thoughtful, and supportive conversations around challenging issues. It is important that, as places of learning, Wayland schools support students who come from different backgrounds and that we promote a diversity of perspectives.”

Statement from Police Chief Patrick Swanick:

“Wayland is continuing to do what Wayland always does, and it does an exceptional job at it. It continues to talk, educate and hold discussions. The whole community --especially the schools -- is marked by extreme respectfulness and tolerance.”
